### ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 23

#### PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE CROSSING

NOTICE is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police, intends to:-

1. remove the following uncontrolled (zebra) crossing in the City of Bristol:-

<u>Location</u>	<u>No. of Crossings</u>
Across Wellington Hill West (Horfield and Westbury-on-Trym & Henleaze wards), south east of its junction with Kendon Drive	1 (zebra)

2. install the following uncontrolled (parallel) segregated crossing for pedestrians and cyclists in the City of Bristol:-

<u>Location</u>	<u>No. of Crossings</u>
Across Wellington Hill West (Horfield and Westbury-on-Trym & Henleaze wards), south east of its junction with Kendon Drive	1 (parallel)

Note: The crossing proposed to be installed will be in the same location as the crossing proposed to be removed.
